Fernbridge became the longest reinforced concrete bridge in the world. Since then the "Queen of Bridges" has withstood floods, earthquakes and careless drivers. Its birthday inspired a new exhibit featuring Fernbridge and other county bridges. With as many rivers and streams as Humboldt County has, that's lots of bridges — made of rope, logs, planks, iron and concrete.

The Clarke has partnered with the HSU Solar Thermal Engineering class with the intention to get the Museum up to 21<sup>st</sup> century standards. The goal is to harness green energy power to not only cut down on our utility bills but also to help the planet in the process. The class is broken down into three teams, with each designing a system they feel will best serve the Clarke. It is our hope that the best of these plans will be implemented in the near future.

#### WELCOME HOME KI-WE-LAT-TAH

The unveiling of the 1852 portrait by Stephen William Shaw of the Wiyot Leader Ki-we-lat-tah will happen at Arts' Alive on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Ki-we-lat-tah was a strong leader who still has many decedents living in the area. He gained particular notice from Euro-Americans in 1849 by aiding the Gregg/ Wood party as they attempted the first overland expedition from the Trinity mines to the Pacific Ocean. The restoration of this beautiful historic portrait was made possible by a grant from the Arcata Foundation and donors Arlene & Bill Hartin. It took over a year and it has been worth the wait as the portrait looks fantastic!
