EDWARDIAN TEXTILE EXHIBIT



The Clarke has a new textile exhibit up featuring the clothing of May Pearsall. Born in Eureka in 1874 as Hettie May Wilson, she married Clarence E. Pearsall in The couple became wealthy through timber sales around this time. The Pearsalls lived in a house on Second Street, today home to the Looking Glass Restaurant. This magnificent collection of clothing from the 1910s to the 1930s reflects the family's wealth.

The Clarke Museum thanks the Petitt family for donating this fantastic collection as very few items of clothing from this era have survived. The quality of materials, care and styling that went into this collection is simply amazing. Clothing such as the lace afternoon dress. the pink silk tea dress, green wool opera coat and two-

piece worsted wool riding suit clearly demonstrates that May Pearsall was an elegant and stylish woman of exquisite taste. How lucky we are to be stewards of this fine collection.

The Mission of the Clarke Historical Museum is the acquisition, preservation and educational display of objects relating to the history of Eureka and Humboldt County, in order to further appreciation by residents, visitors and school children of the area's rich and diverse heritage, and to promote increased visitation to our historic region.

Since 2008 and the ensuing recession, the Clarke has been forced to drastically reduce its overall budget, which primarily fell on reducing payroll. The Board and staff send a heartfelt thank you to Pam Service for her 12 years of hard work and wish her all the luck in the future. To help address the budget shortfall, I'm pleased to announce the newest annual fundraiser for the Clarke Museum, the **Murder Mystery Masquerade Ball** on May 5th. Along with the annual **Salmon Barbeque** in August, many smaller events are planned throughout the year, so keep checking the Clarke's website for upcoming events.

The leaking roof in the 100 year old historic Bank of Eureka building is the major infrastructure issue we are addressing. While countless hours of work have been poured into trying to fix the roof by volunteers, we are now turning to the professionals. We are focusing our grant writing on addressing this issue as well as holding a community wide fundraiser in hopes of raising the necessary funding for these needed repairs.



100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE GIRL SCOUTS

The Clarke has an exhibit of uniforms, badges, photos and memorabilia commemorating the Girl Scout legacy in Humboldt County. Initially called the American Girl Guides, the first troop was established in Savannah, Georgia on March 12, 1912 by Juliette Gordon Low. The items on display are on loan to the museum from Eliane Reed and the Girl Scouts of Northern California Heritage Committee and will be at the museum through June. Summer and early fall will bring changes to the exhibit on Karuk art and culture, titled Pi'êep Káru Payêem: Long Ago and Today. In May, the contemporary artists' section will be rotated, giving us the opportunity to display new artwork from Karuk artists. May is also when the debut of the catalog, produced by Julian Lang, will be available for sale. But come September, the exhibit will leave the Clarke Museum and travel to the Karuk museum in Happy Camp, called the People's Center. The Karuk Tribe's museum committee is deciding what display themes to focus on; we are all excited to see the exhibit's second life! While it's hard to see this great exhibit leave the Clarke, we are proud to announce that the Clarke Museum will host Ron Johnson and Colleen Kelley Marks' exhibit on "made for the trade baskets" in November. This exhibit focuses on baskets produced for the national market during the early 1900s and opens at the Trinidad Museum in early summer.


